“Yummy!” “Really Yummy!” “Hmmm,” Goldie Locks said and ate up all the porridge.

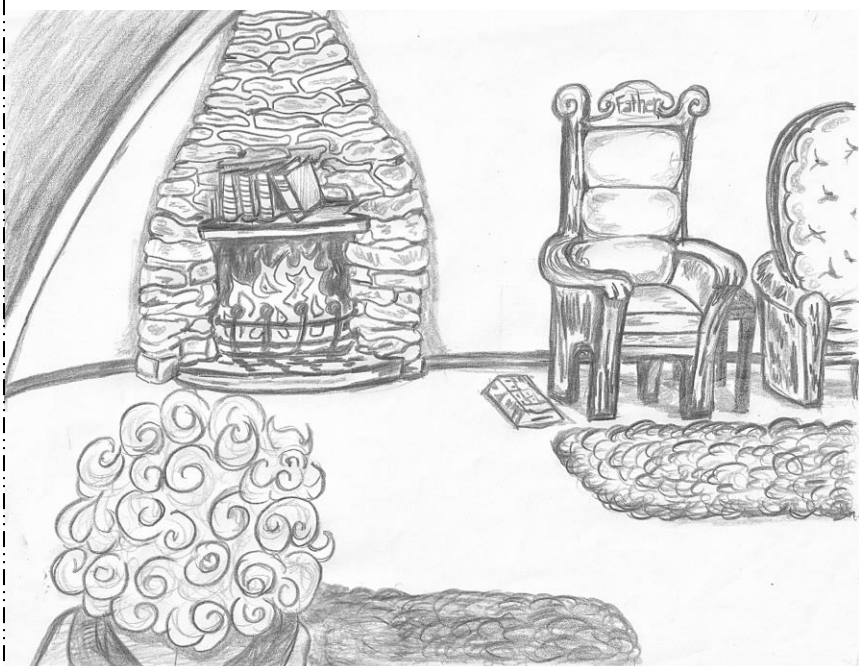


Goldie Locks burped and yawned stretching her arms out and over her head.

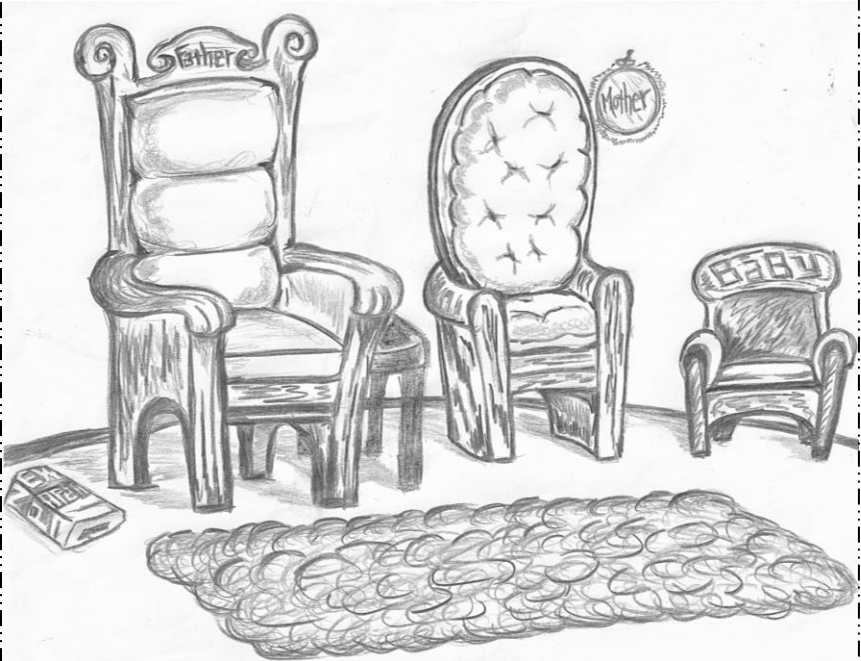
“Wow.” “That was great!” Goldie locks said out loud.

“Oh, no,” Goldie Locks said as she picked herself up off the floor where she found herself surrounded by timber of the broken chair that laid in pieces on the living room floor.

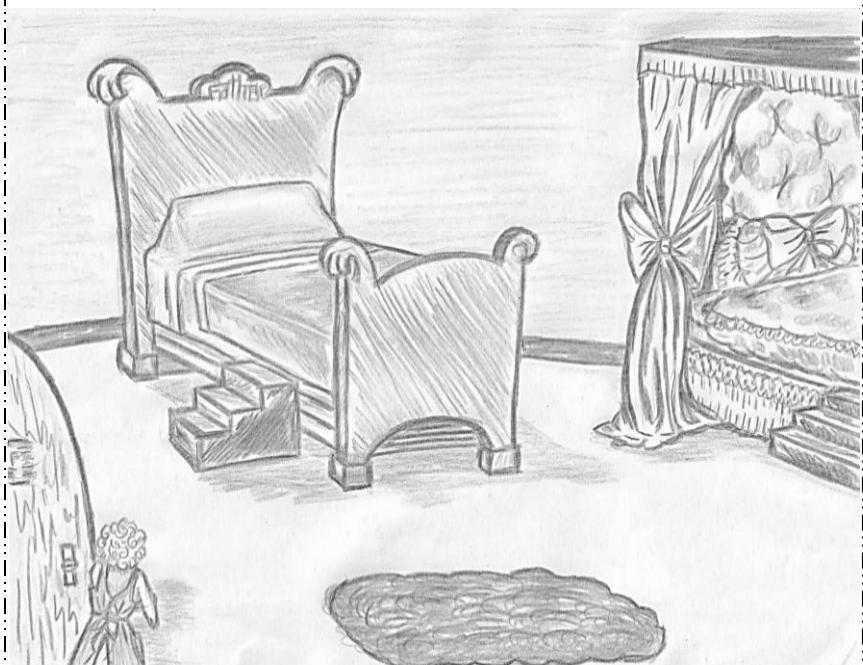


“Oh, no,” Goldie Locks said as she piled the pieces together on the floor in front of herself.

Knock! Knock! Knock! Gently Goldie Locks knocked at the door with every little knock the door gently glided a little bit farther open.



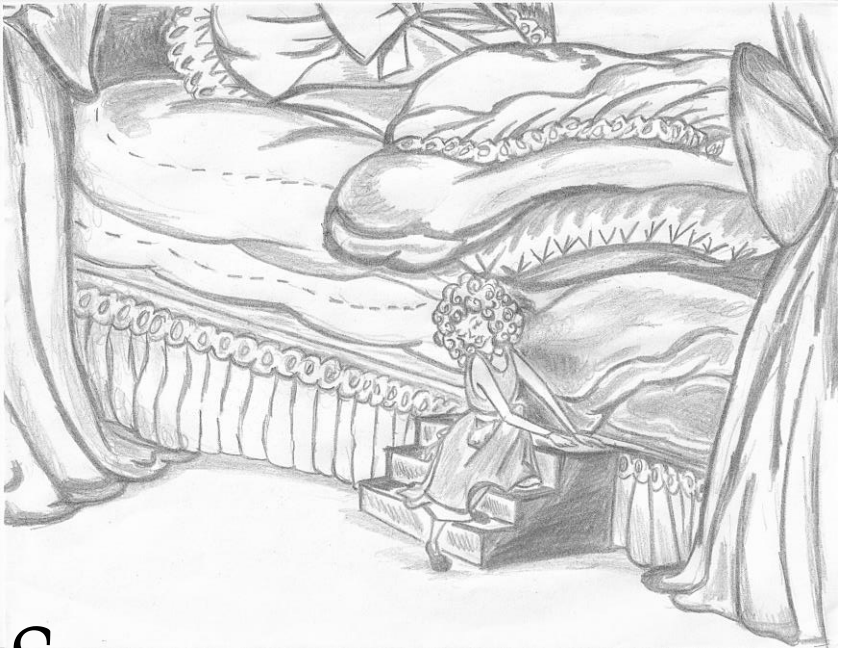

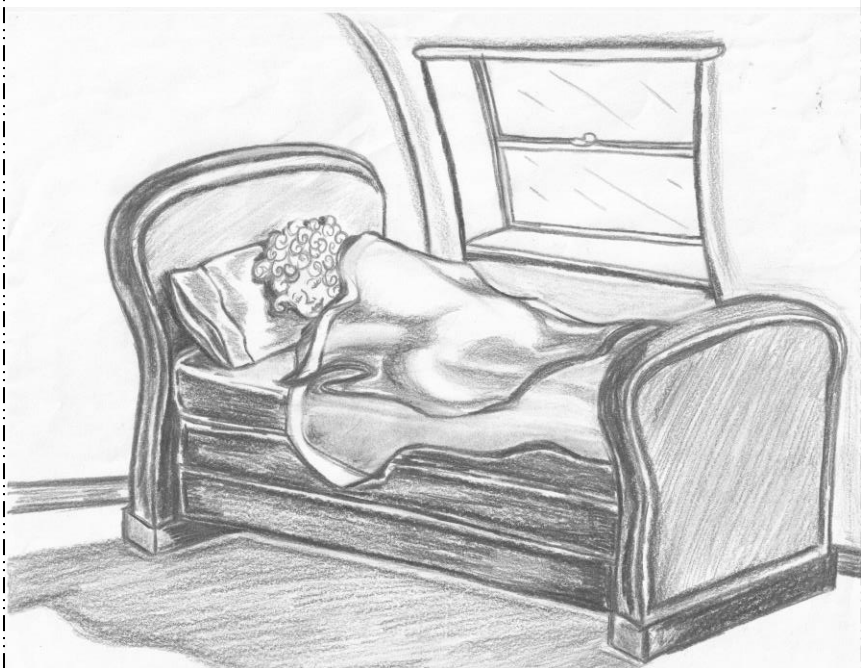
“**O**ooh,” Goldie Locks said as she yawned and stretched with arms up and out from sides then above her head.

“Oh, no!” father bear said as he held up his spoon after he looked into his very, very large bowl. “Somebody’s been eating my porridge.”

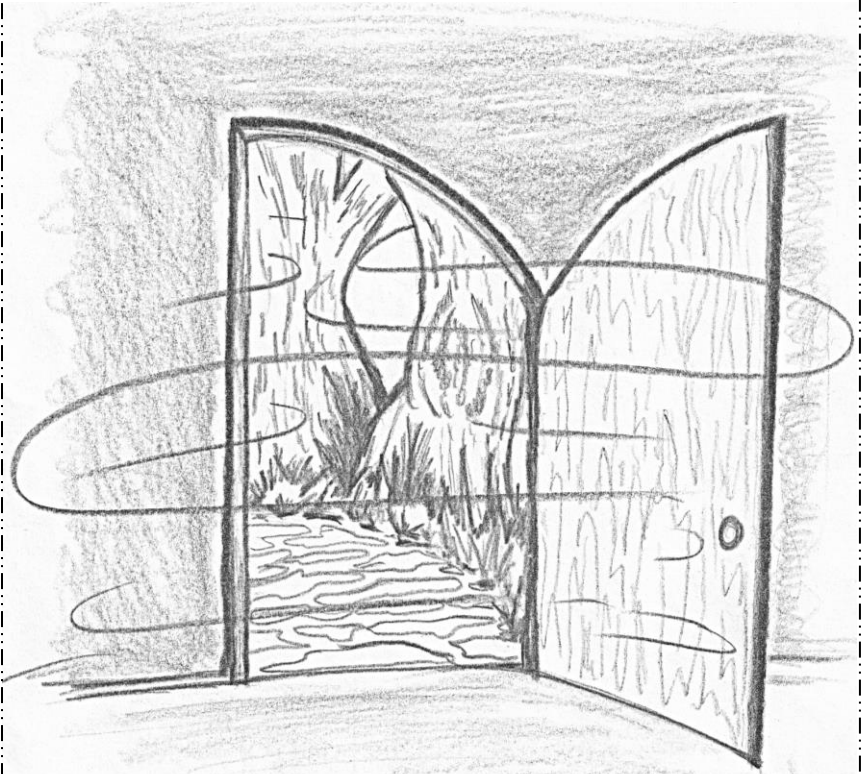


Mother bear and baby bear held up their spoons after they looked into their bowls and announced in unison, “Somebody’s been eating my porridge.”

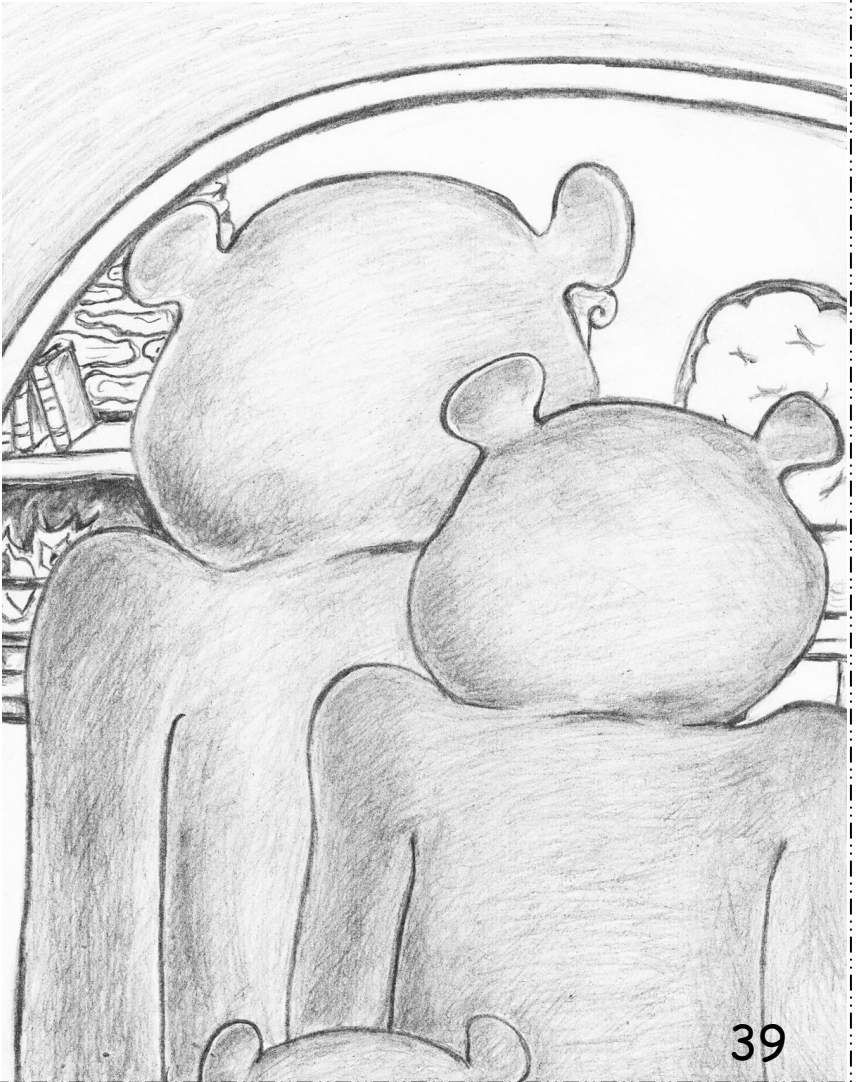


Baby bear added then, “And they ate all mine up!”

Father bear slid himself out of the chair and walked into the living room. Mother bear and baby bear followed into the living room where ...

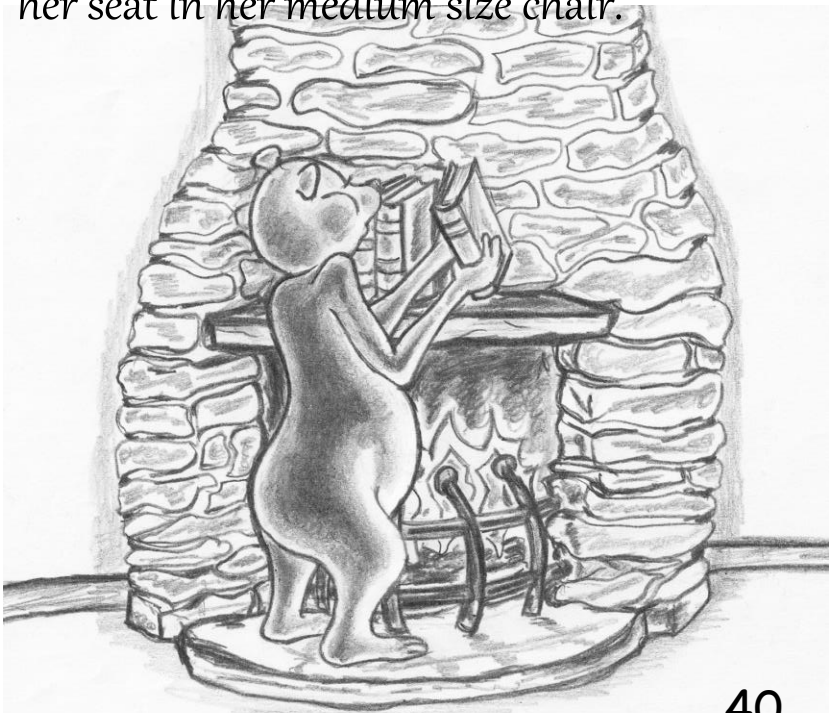


...they watched father bear grab the newspaper...

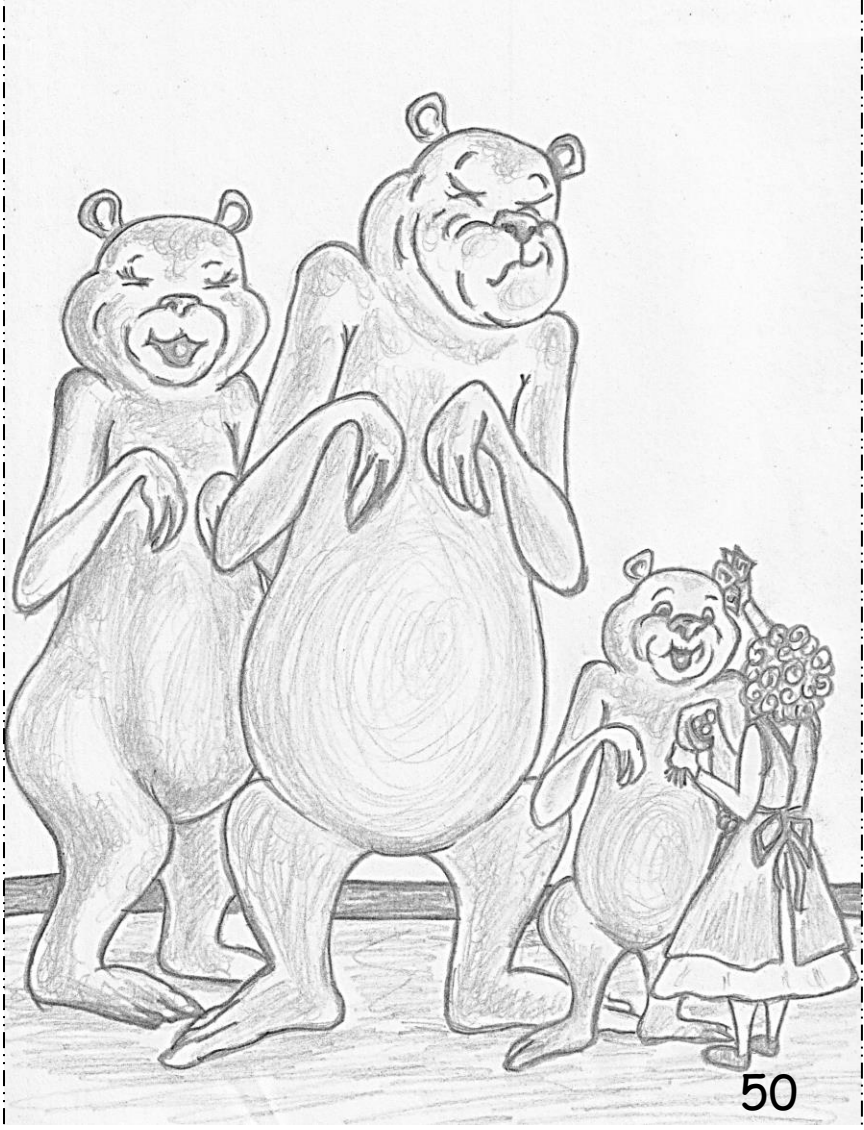

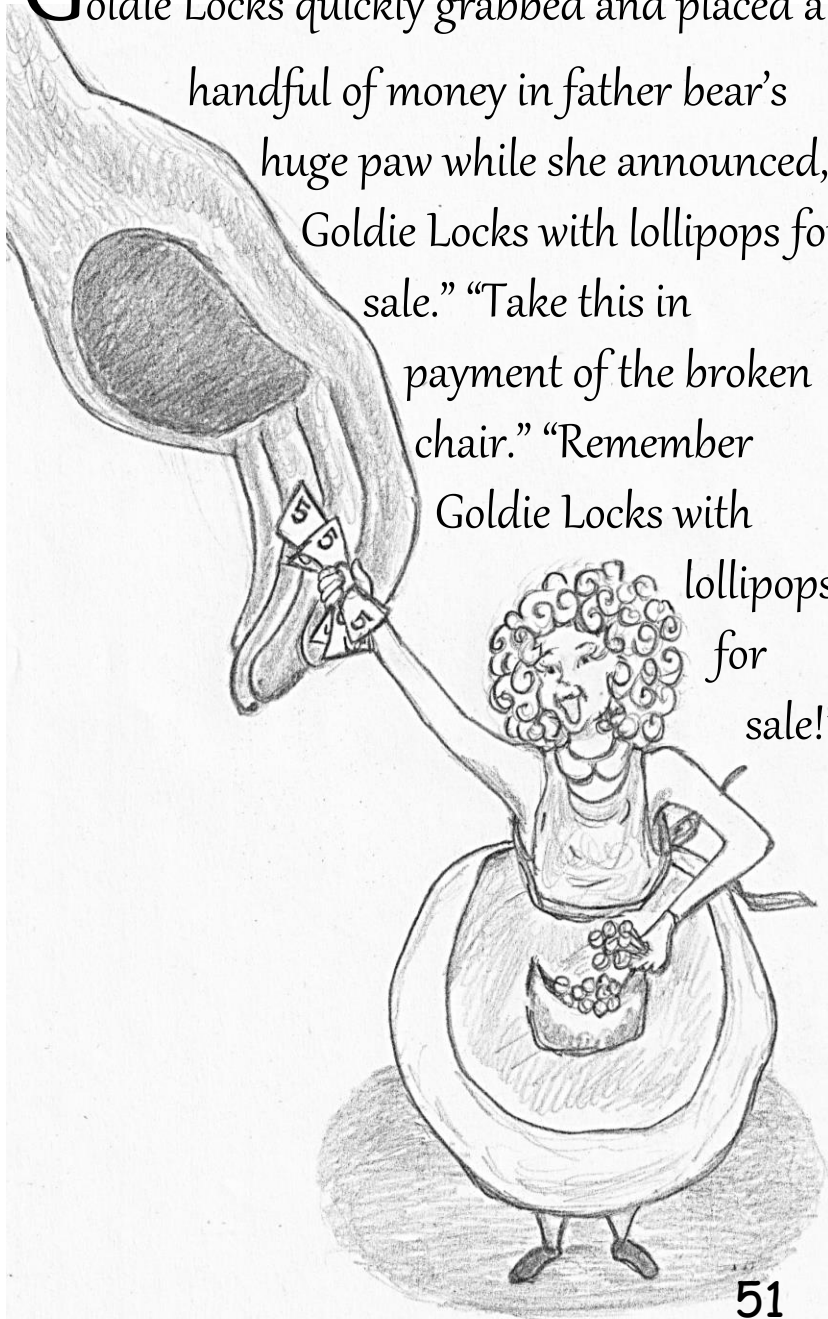
