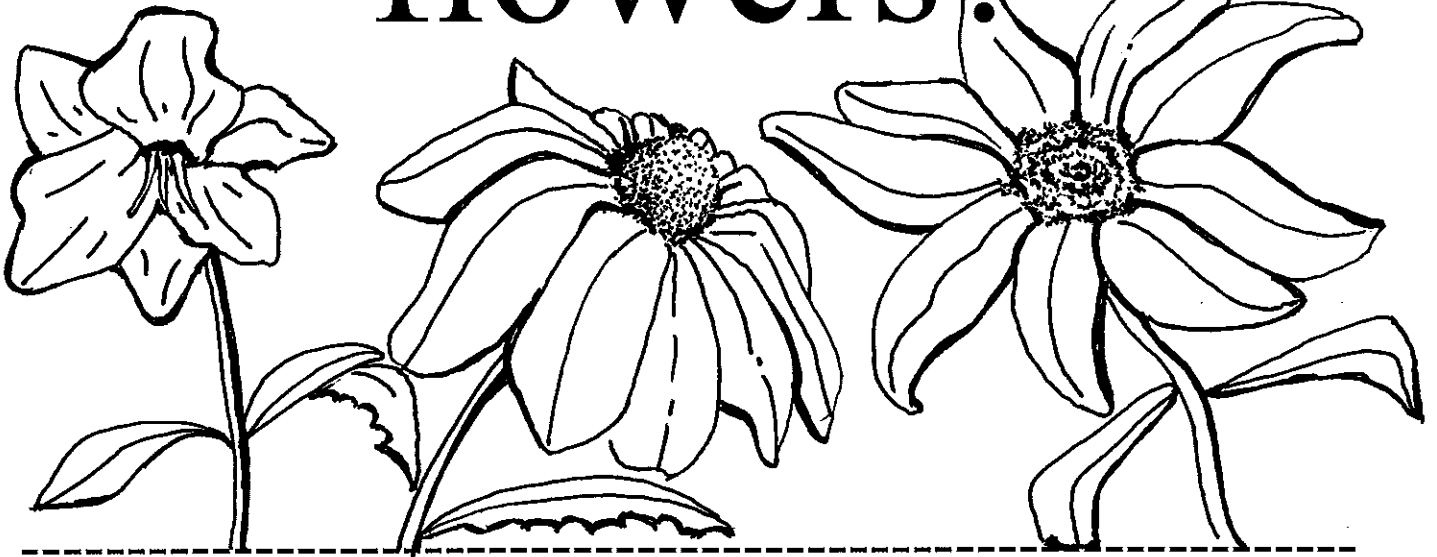


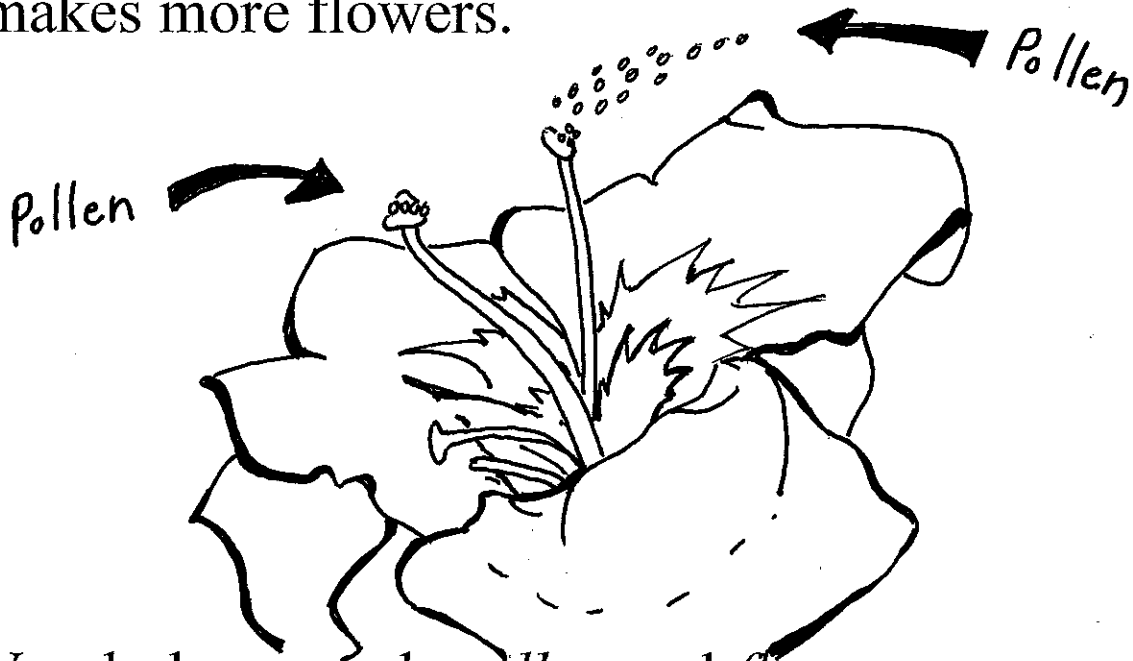
# Who plants the flowers?



## Sight Word Vocabulary Definitions:

- animals-** usually furry mammals that carry their babies in their tummies  
not birds, reptiles, or fish
- bees-** insects that collect nectar from plants that have flowers
- flowers-** the colorful silky part of the plant that helps in making more  
flower plants
- neighbor-** a person or persons that live next door
- pollen-** the powder that flowers produce that helps make more flowers
- wind-** the air around us that feels like a breeze
- you-** a name given by a human being to another human being that  
takes the place of their first or last name instead of calling them  
by their first or last name

*Pollen* makes *flowers* multiply. When pollen from one flower is placed special on another flower it makes more flowers.

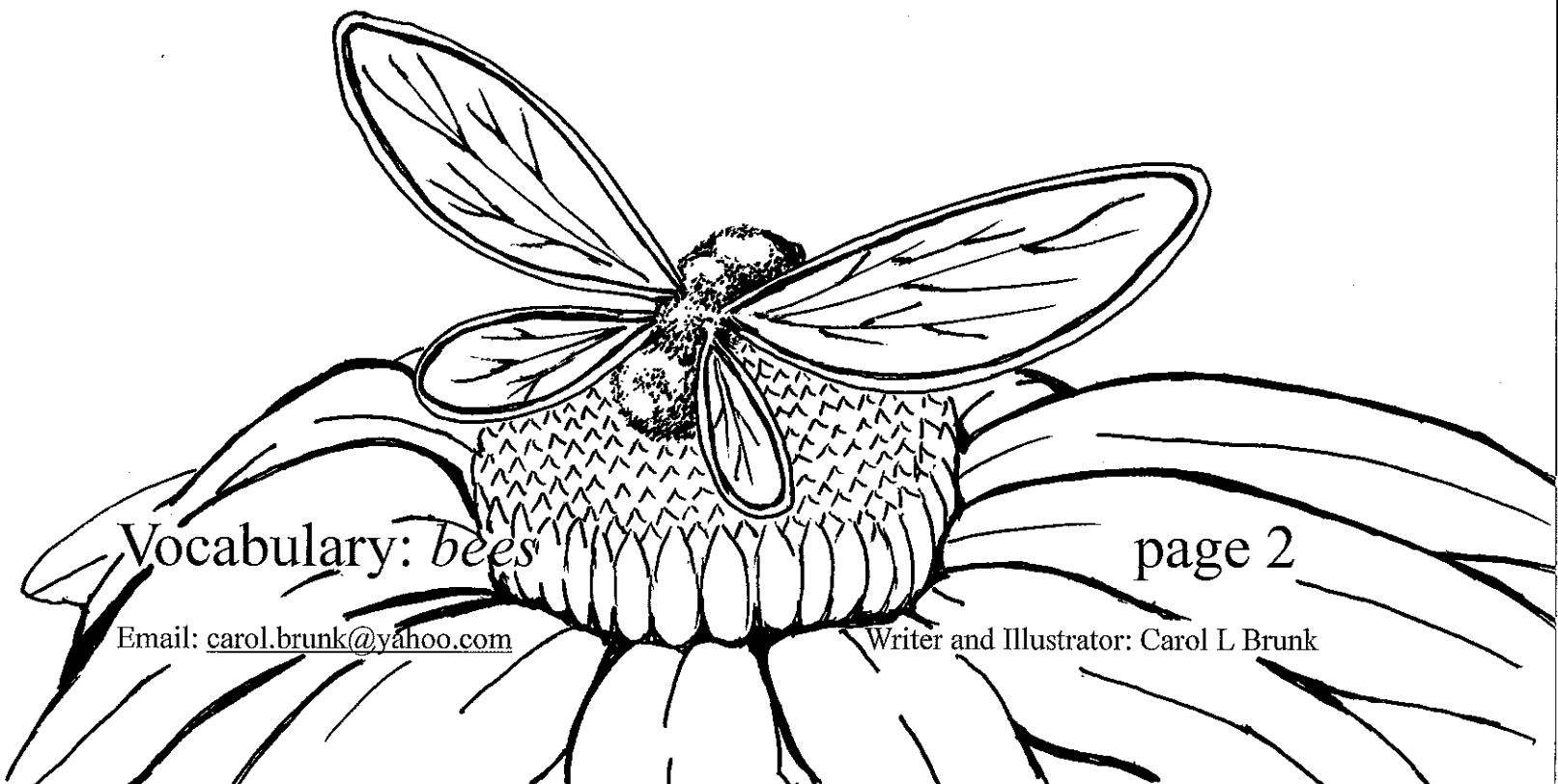


Vocabulary word: *pollen* and *flowers*

*Bees* pick-up pollen on their legs while they take the nectar out of flowers. The pollen drops out on different flowers to make more flowers.



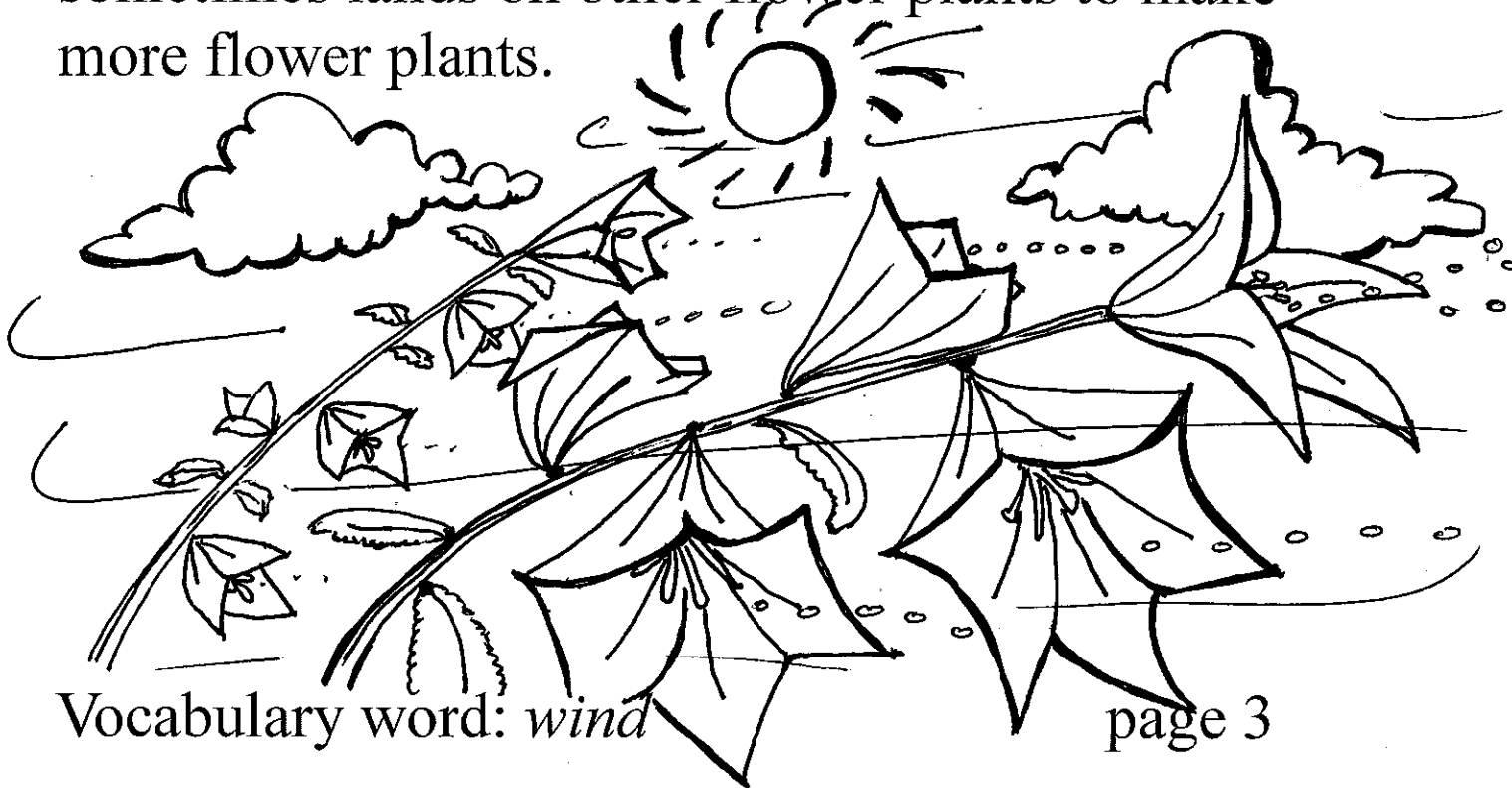

The *wind* blows pollen off the flower plants and sometimes lands on other flower plants to make more flower plants.

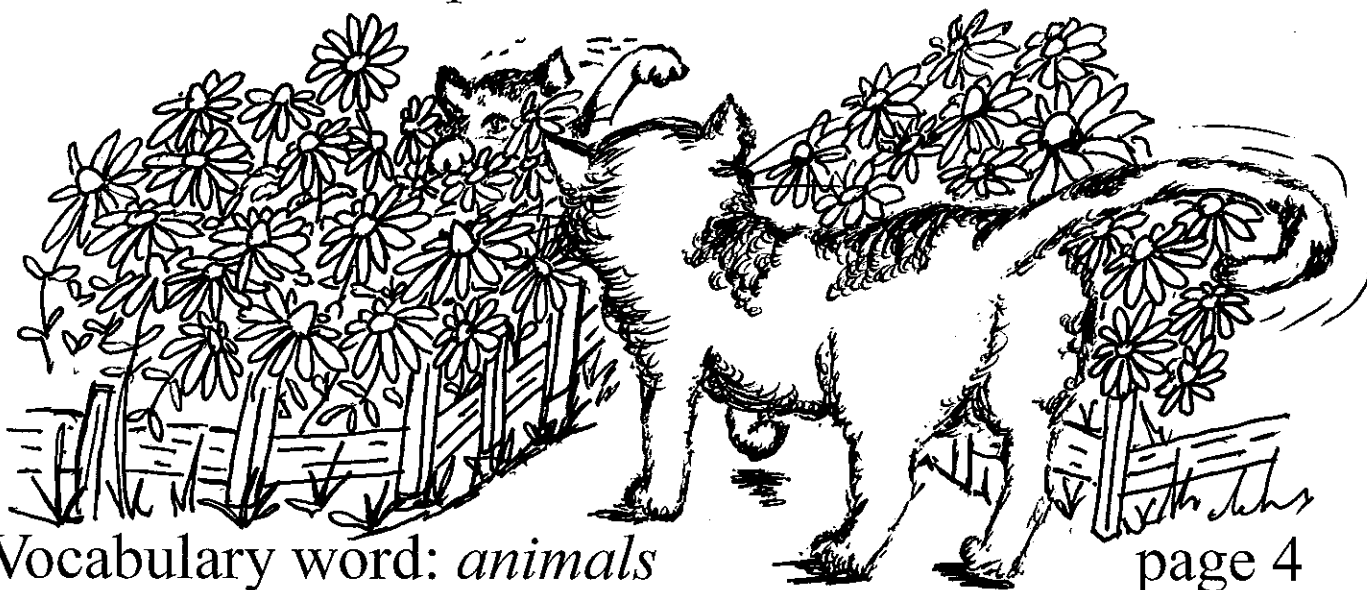

The *neighbor* plants a packet of flower seeds and small flower plants.

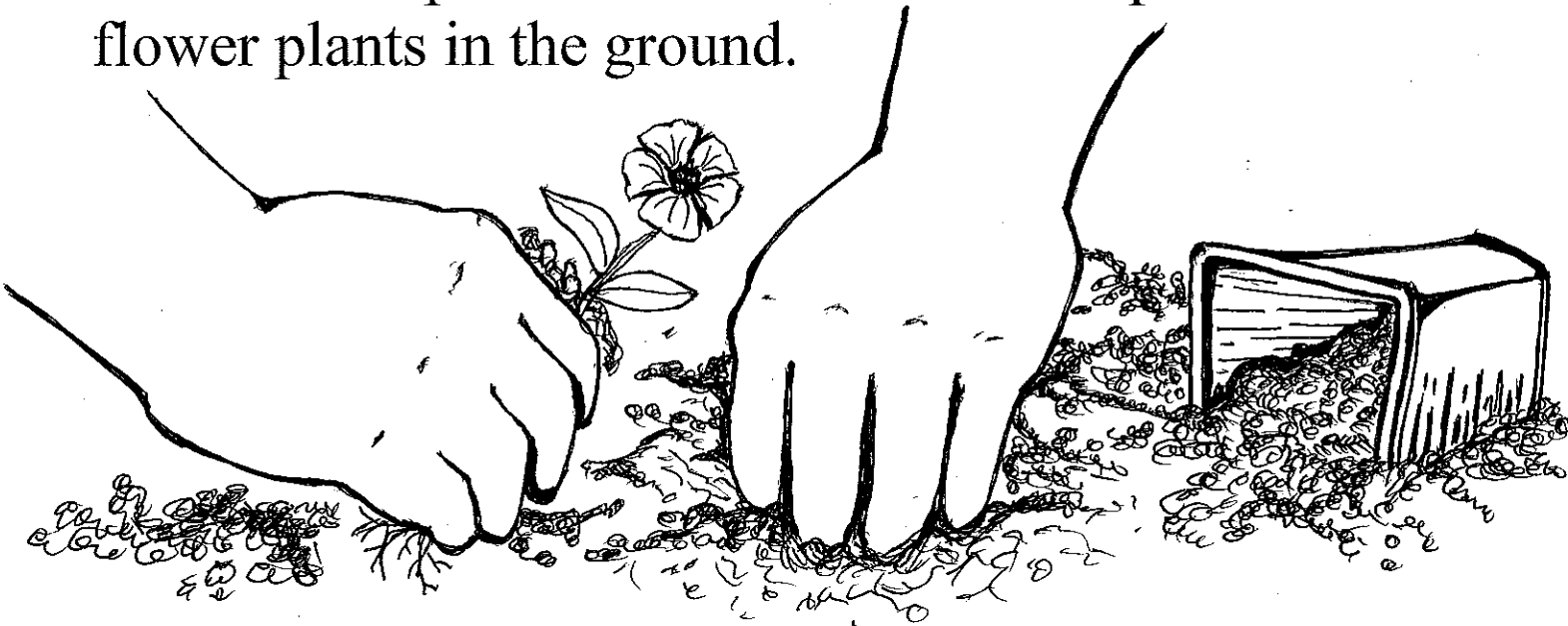

*You* can also plant flowers with seeds or put small flower plants in the ground.

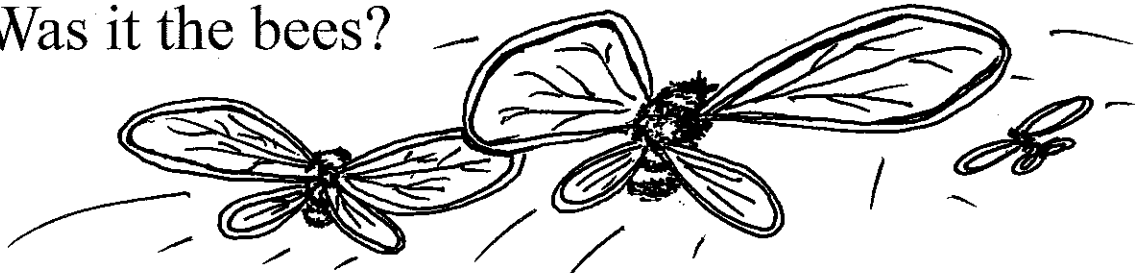

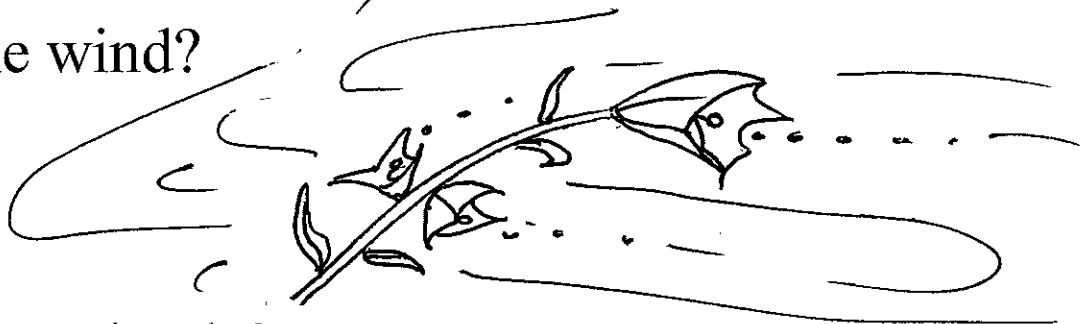

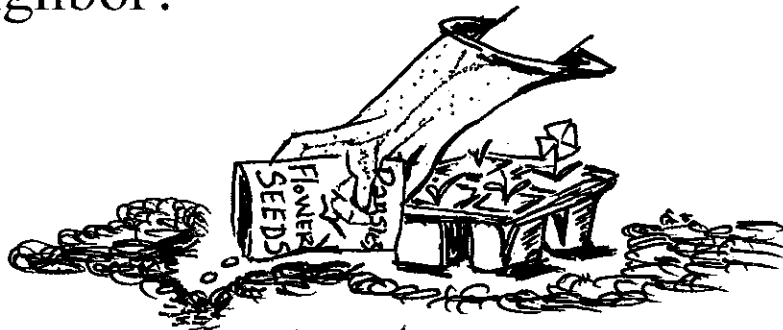
